












Project Overview

Greystones Railway Station is located on Church Road and was opened in the autumn of 1856. The architect was George Wilkinson, who also designed the Railway Stations at Dalkey, Harcourt Street and Wicklow. One of the events of note that occurred at the station was the arrest of Eamon de Valera in May 1918 when he was stepping off the train onto the station platform.

Over the years Greystones Railway Station has received basic maintenance from Irish Rail, mostly of a technical and public facility nature but has considerably deteriorated with regard to its general appearance, particularly within the confines of the station itself and along both platforms. In terms of visitors arriving by train, this may be their first impression of Greystones. The current promoters together with Greystones Town Team are now determined to deliver on what was initially identified, and proposed some years ago by the very active Tidy Towns and Greystones 2020 as we not believe that it creates a sufficiently positive or accurate image of the town, its history, legacy, vibrancy or community.

The project involves a complete makeover of the station, with the integration of stunning visual elements telling the story of the town. In addition to rows of spectacular Corten Steel Totems displaying artistic portraits of legends associated with Greystones, the station will also be decorated with wall painted murals, Portuguese Laurel hedging, colourful planter pots plus additional practical seating facilities. This is a unique opportunity to contribute to the rebirth of Greystones' historic Railway Station and to play your role in its renaissance.

The promoters have retained leading local architect Colum O' Broin to oversee the quality and implementation of this beautiful project. Spatial Design & Visualisations are by AODH Design Agency (Founder & Director - Eoghan O' Broin)

Cement your place in the local community by sponsoring one of these 3m x 1.4m landmark artisan Corten Steel Totems featuring striking portraits of Greystones legends.



















Nostalgic Platform Mural

Portuguese Laurel Hedging


Portuguese Laurel (also known as Prunus Lusitanica) is an elegant evergreen plant featuring pointed, glossy leaves and maroon-coloured stems. White, fragrant flowers blossom in summer alongside small red fruits, which are popular with bees, butterflies and birds.

Rows of Portuguese Laurel hedging will encase Greystones Railway Station, providing a luscious backdrop which reflects the natural beauty of Greystones and Wicklow.

This hedging can be sponsored in small sections or in its entirety, providing flexible options. Sponsors/donors will be acknowledged on a single plaque within the station building.


With their unique character and variety of colours, the Scoop planters are robustly constructed in "rotomoulded polyethylene", which are lightweight but still exceptionally strong, as well as being frostproof and UV colour stable. The stylish Valencia planters are made from galvanised steel.
